2025 MSCA Doctoral Networks (MSCA-DN)

What is the Doctoral Networks programme?

Doctoral Networks funds ambitious joint research projects through academic and non-academic partnerships, implemented by doctoral candidates working on individual research projects. The program provides comprehensive funding for recruitment, training and mobility of doctoral candidates for up to 540 person-months over a 4-5 year period.

What are the types of Doctoral Networks?

- 1. **Standard (DN-ST):** Recruitment and training of doctoral candidates in the academy and/or industry with academic supervision.
- 2. **Industrial Doctorates (DN-ID):** Recruitment and training of doctoral candidates both in the academy and industry with joint supervision, where at least 50% of the researchers' fellowship is in the non-academic sector.
- 3. **Joint Doctorates (DN-JD):** Project offering researchers joint/multiple doctoral degrees. Collaboration is required between all involved institutions, with joint selection and supervision. Pre-agreement for joint degrees is required.

Who can apply?

- At least three independent legal entities ("Beneficiaries"), each established in a different EU Member State
 and Horizon Europe Associated Country (e.g. Israel), out of which at least one beneficiary is from an EU
 Member State country.
- On top of this minimum, any entity from **any other country in the world** can join as an "Associated Partner", without being eligible to receive EU funding.
- The consortium can consist of universities, research institutions and research infrastructures, businesses including SMEs, and any other socio-economic actors.

What is the duration of Doctoral Networks?

- The entire Project duration is maximum 48 months for DN-ST and DN-ID, and 60 months for DN-JD.
- EU grants are available for up to 540 person-months.
- Fellowship's duration for each researcher is 3-36 months for DN-ST and DN-ID, and 3-48 months for DN-JD.

How does it work?

- Upon proposal approval the consortium shall propose job offers and recruit doctoral candidates, i.e.
 researchers without a doctoral degree at the date of the recruitment, of any nationality, that enrolled in a
 doctoral, to work on individual research projects.
- Minimum of 1 researcher recruitment per beneficiary; up to 10 researchers for the standard programme and a total of up to 15 researchers for DN-ID or DN-JD.

Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) are researchers' mobility programmes, which are part of the Horizon Europe programme, aimed at equipping researchers with new knowledge and skills and providing them with an international as well as inter-sectoral exposure. The MSCA have a bottom-up approach, open to all research domains and applicable for researchers from any nationality and any country.

Israel-Europe R&I Directorate (ISERD) is a division in the Israel Innovation Authority mandated to promote the participation of Israeli entities in the funding opportunities of the European Commission. It serves as the bridge between the Israeli government and the European Commission and aims to increase the success rate of Israeli applicants in one of the largest and most competitive framework programs.
